- March 19th - There will be a demonstration on how to make fresh goat cheese.

- May 21st - Mark Zavicar will address preparing your air conditioner for the summer.

When relevant, the classes will include a brief demonstration of some of the library's useful, new electronic resources that correspond to the subjects taught, including *The Hobbies & Crafts Reference Center* and *The Home Improvement Reference Center*.
