Author Steve Davis to Speak on Dallas in the Time of JFK Assassination

New Braunfels, Texas — Steve Davis, curator of the Wittliff Collections at Texas State University, will talk about his new book, *Dallas 1963*, at the New Braunfels Public Library on Wednesday, January 29th at 7 p.m. The book, which Davis co-authored with Bill Minutaglio, a professor of journalism at the University of Texas at Austin, chronicles the social and political atmosphere of the city where President Kennedy died 50 years ago.

Davis, a New Braunfels resident, provides insights into the many different political forces at work in Dallas at the time of the assassination, including the schemes of radicals, reactionaries and political extremists.

Publisher's Weekly gave *Dallas 1963* a starred review and wrote of the book: "After 50 years, it's a challenge to fashion a new lens with which to view the tragic events of November 22, 1963—yet Texans Minutaglio and Davis pull it off brilliantly."

While the book will not be on sale after the event, it can be purchased in advance from independent booksellers and from Amazon.com. Davis will be on hand to sign copies of his book after his talk.
