## **Lindheimer Plaza Receives Lone Star Legacy Designation**

**New Braunfels, Texas** – Lindheimer Plaza, named after Ferdinand Lindheimer the “Father of Texas Botany,” was honored with designation as a Lone Star Legacy Park by the Texas Recreation and Parks Society (TRAPS) in a ceremony at the association’s annual institute in Corpus Christi on February 19, 2014.

A Lone Star Legacy Park is classified as a park that holds special prominence in the local community and the state of Texas. To qualify for consideration, the park must have endured the test of time and become iconic to those who have visited, played and rested on its grounds. A designation as a Lone Star Legacy is one of the highest honors that can be bestowed on a park. Nominated parks had to meet at least one of the following criteria:

- The property represents distinctive design and/or construction.
- The park is associated with historic events or sites.
- The park is associated with events specific to the local community/state.
- The park is home to unique natural features.

“The purpose of the designation is to recognize what a park means to a particular community,” said Stacey Dicke, Parks and Recreation Director. “Lindheimer Plaza is a unique treasure that meets not one, but all of the nomination criteria. We greatly appreciate the significant contributions of the New Braunfels Garden Club and Guada Coma Garden Club members, in working with us to obtain this honor.”

Legacy Parks must be a minimum of 50 years old and all parks so designated will be included in a state-wide initiative promoting Heritage Tourism. Lindheimer Plaza was one of eight Texas parks honored with the designation as Lone Star Legacy Park by TRAPS this year.
