**Suspect in Dollar General Armed Robbery Arrested**

New Braunfels, Texas — The New Braunfels Police Department is announcing the arrest of a suspect believed responsible for the recent armed robbery of a Dollar General store.

On April 29, 2015, at approximately 10pm, a man entered the Dollar General in the 1800 block of South Walnut Avenue. The man displayed a black semi-automatic handgun, demanded money from employees, and fled the scene on foot after taking an undisclosed amount of cash, 4 cartons of cigarettes, an electronic store inventory device, and other various items that he carried out in a yellow plastic Dollar General shopping bag. He was last seen exiting the store and heading north on foot in the general direction of I-35.

On May 7, 2015, at approximately 12:30am, the United States Marshals Service Lone Star Fugitive Task Force in cooperation with detectives from the New Braunfels Police Department arrested 47-year old Robert Dewayne Sisco. Sisco was located in the parking lot of a hotel on the northeast side of San Antonio in the 11000 block of IH-35 North.

According to the Lone Star Fugitive Task Force: "While conducting surveillance, task force officers observed Sisco drive a vehicle into the motel parking lot. Task force officers approached the vehicle, identified themselves, removed Sisco from the vehicle, and took him into custody without incident. Subsequent to the arrest, Sisco was found to be in possession of drug paraphernalia, along with a handgun, U.S. currency, and cartons of cigarettes that could potentially be linked to the robbery."

Sisco was transported to the Comal County Jail and booked on a 1<sup>st</sup> degree felony charge of Aggravated Robbery with bond set at \$200,000. Aggravated Robbery is considered a First Degree Felony under the Texas Penal Code (TPC 29.03) and is punishable by 5 to 99 years to life in prison, if convicted.
