## **Duffy Hudson Performs as Audie Murphy at the New Braunfels Public Library**

**New Braunfels, TX** - Duffy Hudson, an actor who has performed on Broadway as well as in feature films and television, will perform his one-man show, "To Hell and Back: the Audie Murphy Story," on Monday, June 29<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m. at the New Braunfels Public Library.

In keeping with the Summer Reading Program's "Every Hero Has a Story" theme, the library has chosen this theatrical program about America's most highly decorated World War II soldier, Audie Murphy. The show delves into the WWII combat experiences of Murphy, his life, and his crusade to help veterans with post-traumatic stress syndrome.

Duffy Hudson, actor, director, writer, teacher, and filmmaker, attended the Circle in the Square Theater School on Broadway. He has performed on Broadway in productions of *The Misanthrope* and *Enemies*, and off-Broadway in dozens of productions including *Nana*, *Twelfth Night*, *Winter's Tale*, *Macbeth* and *A Report To The Academy*, which he performed at "The Actors Studio." Hudson has directed over 300 theatrical pieces, including workshop productions with Brooke Shields, *The Three Sisters* with Jessica Lange, Don Johnson, and Tatum O'Neal, and *Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf* with Marlo Thomas. He also wrote and starred with Lynda Carter in the independent film *Tattered Angel*.

"We're thrilled to present Duffy Hudson's theatrical performance on Audie Murphy, a great American hero and a native Texan," said Library Director, Gretchen Pruett. "I think our community will enjoy seeing this depiction of Murphy, learning about his life, his intense war experiences, and his heroism."
