NBPD Arrests Apparent Serial Fast Food Restaurant Robbery Suspect

New Braunfels, Texas — A cooperative investigation between the New Braunfels Police Department, the Selma Police Department, and the San Antonio Police Department has led to the capture of an apparent serial fast food restaurant robbery suspect.

On July 20th, 2015, at around 7pm, officers with the New Braunfels Police Department were called to the Burger King located at the corner of I-35 and Seguin Avenue (in the 200 block of I-35 North) for reports of a robbery that had just occurred. Witnesses told officers that a man had entered the store and used an Electronic Control Device (also known as a stun gun) on the clerk in order to take cash from the register. The suspect then fled the store on foot, crossing over Seguin Avenue to a waiting car in the Courtyard Plaza Shopping Center parking lot. The car fled the scene, but witnesses told officers it was a red 4-door Toyota sedan. Minutes later, an officer spotted a vehicle matching that description traveling northbound on I-35 and performed a traffic stop on the access road just past the Creekside area (in the 3500 block of I-35 North). The driver matched the description of the robbery suspect and he was found in possession of the stolen cash from the restaurant and a stun gun. 22-year old Brandon Breaux from Houston was then arrested, taken to the Comal County Jail, and charged with Robbery, which is a 2nd degree felony. A female passenger in the car, identified as 20-year old Corrine Clifford from Houston, was also arrested on an outstanding arrest warrant out of Montgomery County and for Failure to Identify.

Following Breaux's arrest, it was learned that similar robberies (or attempted robberies) had occurred earlier in the day in both San Antonio and Selma to include a Taco Cabana and a McDonalds restaurant along I-35 near Rittiman Road, and a Starbucks location in the Forum Shopping Center in Selma. The suspect in those crimes matched the description of the suspect arrested here in New Braunfels, and a similar method of robbery was used in all 4 of the crimes. The cooperative investigation continues and additional crimes in the Houston area may also be linked to Breaux, with additional charges possible.
