**San Antonio Jazz Group, “The Bill King Quartet” at the New Braunfels Public Library**

**New Braunfels, TX** - Nationally acclaimed San Antonio Jazz group, The Bill King Quartet, will give a repeat performance at the New Braunfels Public Library on Tuesday, July 19th at 7:00 p.m. in the library’s meeting room. The quartet’s performance is their third at the library. Bill King, a noted saxophonist, leads The King William Jazz Collective, and The Bill King Quartet, which perform at San Antonio jazz venues.

The concert will be one hour in length, and will feature traditional jazz pieces by jazz greats Dave Brubeck, Charlie Parker, Paul Desmond, and others. This concert will appeal to jazz aficionados, families with children, and anyone who has yet to experience the excitement and creativity of a live jazz performance.

“We are thrilled to welcome the Bill King Quartet back to the library for a summer concert. Last summer’s concert was attended by over 100 people,” said Assistant Library Director, Lynn Thompson.

While serving in the United States Air Force, Bill King performed as a woodwind specialist. During many of those years Bill was the music director of the Jazz bands at United States Air Force (USAF) Band of the Golden West, USAF Reserve Band, USAF in Europe Band and the USAF Band of the West. After retiring from the Air Force, King established himself by playing with some of the area’s best bands including the San Antonio Jazz Orchestra, Gerry Gibb’s ‘Thrasher’ Big Band, The Paul Elizondo Orchestra, The Mambo Kings and Henry Brun’s Latin Players. In 2013-2014 the group released two jazz albums: “Debut,” by The Bill King Quartet and the self-titled King William Jazz Collective.
