Public Encouraged to Attend Urban Wildlife Management Workshop on February 28th

New Braunfels, TX – The City of New Braunfels, in partnership with the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD), is hosting an educational workshop regarding urban wildlife management this week. The workshop is for the public and will be held at 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, February 28th at New Braunfels City Hall, located at 550 Landa Street.

This workshop is designed to inform residents on the negative impacts associated with overabundant urban wildlife such as auto collisions, degraded water quality and wildlife health. The City and TPWD will be presenting on multiple issues that have arisen due to excessive urban wildlife in the City and will be seeking input from residents on how to address these problems.

“Because urban wildlife management is a complex issue, we encourage residents to attend and participate in this meeting, so they have a clear understanding of the situation and also so City staff obtains an improved understanding of all points of view on this matter,” said Public Works Director Greg Malatek. “For those who cannot attend Wednesday’s meeting, we will provide an on-line survey to collect further input from residents later this week.”
