Public Encouraged to Provide Additional Input on Urban Wildlife Management

New Braunfels, TX – The City of New Braunfels, in collaboration with the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD), recently held two informative workshops for the public on urban wildlife. The first workshop, held on February 28th, was intended to inform residents on the negative impacts associated with overabundant urban wildlife such as auto collisions, degraded water quality and wildlife health.

The second workshop was held on Wednesday, April 11th and focused on the various management strategies available for addressing overabundant urban wildlife. A real-time survey was also conducted at the April 11th meeting to solicit feedback from attendees.
