Library Launches New Summer Literacy Program

New Braunfels, Texas - The New Braunfels Public Library will be launching a new program, named Reading Buddies, that will team up children and teens to participate in fun, literacy-based activities over the critical summer months. Each teen volunteer will be paired with an elementary student and attend a weekly meeting to read together, play literacy games, and do group activities.

The program, which is modeled after an award-winning program at San Jose Public Library, hopes to offset the "summer slide," in which a lack of summer learning opportunities causes a loss of academic achievement.

"We're excited to be rolling out a program that gives teens an opportunity to serve as mentors, and at the same time shows younger kids how fun reading can be," said Youth Services Librarian Ariel Cummins.
