Zilberman to Bring Global Music to Library's Family Program

New Braunfels, TX — Families looking to explore the diverse world of music with their children need look no further than the New Braunfels Public Library, which will be hosting an interactive, global music program performed by international jazz multi-instrumentalist Sagit Zilberman on Friday, February 15th, at 10:30 a.m. at the New Braunfels Public Library, located at 700 E. Common St.

“Sagit is an exceptional musician and loves performing for children and teaching them about different instruments and cultures,” said Youth Services Librarian Jenny Rodriguez. “We are thrilled to be able to have her perform at our library.”

A musician since the age of six, and a graduate of the Berklee College of Music, Zilberman has performed internationally and toured with 25 different bands in more than 15 countries across South America, Europe, the Middle East and Africa. Along the way, she picked up songs and unique instruments from those countries that she now owns and plays.

Zilberman's Songs and Dance from around the Globe aims to introduce audience members to instruments such as the didgeridoo, rainstick, tongue drum, Handpan and saxophone, and - through unique sounds and songs - empowers the young and young-at-heart to use their own voices, rhythm and body as instruments to play and create music with others.

This program is free and open to the public.
