## **Historic Landmark Commission to Hold April 14 Meeting Online**

**New Braunfels, TX** – The City of New Braunfels monthly Historic Landmark Commission meeting will be held as scheduled on Tuesday, April 14 at 8:30 a.m. However, rather than being held in City Council chambers, the meeting will instead be held online.

“In consideration of public safety and to adhere to local and state Stay Home, Work Safe orders, we will use an online platform to host the meeting,” said Christopher Looney, Planning and Development Services Director. “The Commissioners and City staff will conduct the meeting from various locations remotely. Applicants and the public will be able to dial in by phone or log in online to participate or view the meeting.”

Information on how to participate in or view the meeting will be printed on the Commission’s agenda when posted 72 hours prior to the meeting. If a citizen is not able to participate online, comments about an agenda item can be submitted by emailing Caleb Gasparek, Assistant Planner, at [cgasparek@nbtexas.org](mailto:cgasparek@nbtexas.org). The City must receive any such comments or other materials the participants would like to share with the Commission by noon on Monday, April 13.

“We appreciate the flexibility of our residents and commission members during this time,” said Looney.

Appointed by City Council, the Historic Landmark Commission is a nine-member body that considers alterations of structures in historic districts and makes recommendations to City Council on historic landmark and historic district requests. The agenda and packet for the Historic Landmark Commission’s meetings will be available online 72 hours before the meeting.
